ADMISSIONS

Please consult the table below for key information about this degree program's admissions requirements. The program may have more detailed admissions requirements, which can be found below the table or on the program's website.

Graduate admissions is a two-step process between academic programs and the Graduate School. **Applicants must meet the minimum requirements (<https://grad.wisc.edu/apply/requirements/>) of the Graduate School as well as the program(s).** Once you have researched the graduate program(s) you are interested in, apply online (<https://grad.wisc.edu/apply/>).

Fall Deadline	January 15
Spring Deadline	September 1
Summer Deadline	The program does not admit in the summer.
GRE (Graduate Record Examinations)	Not required.
English Proficiency Test	Every applicant whose native language is not English, or whose undergraduate instruction was not exclusively in English, must provide an English proficiency test score earned within two years of the anticipated term of enrollment. Other Test(s) (e.g., GMAT, MCAT)	n/a
Letters of Recommendation Required	3

Admitted applicants must meet the Graduate School minimum requirements (<https://grad.wisc.edu/apply/requirements/>), including completion of a bachelor's degree which typically consists of a satisfactory undergraduate education in fields such as food science, dairy science, chemistry, most biological sciences (e.g., biochemistry, microbiology, nutrition), and engineering (especially chemical and agricultural).

Recommendation for admission is determined solely by the supervising lab faculty member. Final admission is determined by the Graduate School.

Recommendation for admission is made by an individual food science or affiliated faculty member (<https://foodsci.wisc.edu/faculty.php>) usually based on the review of the following:

- applicant's online application
- academic record (scanned PDF academic transcripts)
- English proficiency for international degree-seeking applicants. See Graduate School requirements (<https://grad.wisc.edu/apply/requirements/>) for more information

- recommendation letters (three)
- personal statement (reasons for graduate study) up to two pages double-spaced
- CV or resume
- applicant's particular research interest(s) as indicated in supplemental application
- available funding/space in their research lab

After the application is submitted, applicants should contact faculty (<https://foodsci.wisc.edu/faculty.php>) members directly (via email) to discuss research opportunities in their labs.
