CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

The M.S. in Clinical Nutrition is focused on core nutrition, clinical nutrition, professional skills, and electives. The curriculum is designed to prepare students to translate research; recognize and formulate responses to evolving developments in clinical nutrition practice, policy, and research; and lead and manage professional teams to design nutrition-related services.
