English Proficiency Test	Every applicant whose native language is not English, or whose undergraduate instruction was not exclusively in English, must provide an English proficiency test score earned within two years of the anticipated term of enrollment. Rolling admissions is for domestic applicants only. Domestic applicants interested in applying after the deadlines listed above are encouraged to reach out to the graduate program coordinator/manager for updated deadlines based on available space in program. Application deadlines for

international applicants are strictly followed due to visa requirements and deadlines.

Applicants are encouraged to have completed RP & SE 300 Individuals with Disabilities or equivalent. Applicants may be admitted without completion of this course, but required to complete during the first semester of the program.
